Regulating and Controlling Dogs

- Dogs residing in a subdivision or hamlet must registered and wear a license issued by the Municipal District. The cost of a license is \$20.
 It is in effect for the life of the dog.
 Licenses are not transferable.
- The owner shall obtain a license from the Municipal District Office (licenses are also available at the Cherry Grove Post Office) immediately after the dog is three (3) months old.
- The owner shall obtain a license for a dog when the dog is found running at large.
- The owner shall obtain a license after they become the owner of a dog.
- The owner shall obtain a license for their dog which has been impounded before such dog may be claimed from the pound.

Replacement or Transfer of License

- If a dog license is lost or destroyed, a replacement tag will be issued upon the receipt of a \$5 replacement fee.
- No license is transferable from one dog to another dog.
- An owner who allows his/her dog to run at large is guilty of an offence and may be subject to a fine.





Public Nuisance

The owner of a dog shall not permit the dog to:

- Bite, attack, run at, or attempt to bite, attack, or run at any person or animal
- Bite, bark at or chase bicycles, automobiles or any other vehicles
- Bark, howl, or otherwise disturb any person
- Cause damage to property or other animals
- Worry or annoy any other animals
- Upset waste receptacles or scattering of any garbage receptacles
- Defecate on property other than his/ her own or vacant undeveloped Municipal District property.
